In her 1982 classic book The Color Purple, Black American author and poet Alice Walker says "I think us here to wonder, myself. To wonder. To ask. And that in wondering bout the big things and asking bout

the big things, you learn about the little ones, almost by accident. But you never know nothing more about the big things than you start out with. The more I wonder, the more I love."

Learning is so much more than 'knowing stuff', learning is about wondering, asking about the big things and learning about the little things.

What is God like?

That's a big question, and we can explore it for years and still not 'know', but along the way we will have learnt lots of little (and very important) things.

An example might be that as we re-member that God is love, we also encounter (and express) love in small actions in a multitude of ways - through the roles we have in church, and how we 'be' with our family, friends and in our inner dialogue with ourselves, our attitude at work etc.

Our hope in the Learning Network is that all the learning & development opportunities offered are some of the places where big and little learning can happen, because it all matters. So if it's a theological book club, or a 'how to be a ....' session, it is all learning, and we will always seek to create opportunities for you to 'wonder'.
